

**History of the United Nations General Assembly Resolution
Condemning the United States Embargo on Cuba
October 2013**

The first vote took place in 1992 and repeats annually. A “Yes” vote means that a country supports an end of the U.S. embargo on Cuba. A “No” vote means that a country disagrees and wants the embargo to continue. An “Abstention” means that a country is present during the vote but decides to not vote either “Yes” or “No.”
